

## Online coursework at a glance

Exeter High School offers a wide selection of courses that are rigorous, relevant, and consistent with state and national frameworks and standards. We also recognize that online courses can increase the range of offerings available to our students, provide alternative educational access, and be used for credit recovery. With pre-approval from the principal, Exeter High School students are allowed to transfer credit and a grade for online courses.

Briefly:

- Approved online courses must comply with all federal and state statutes pertaining to student privacy and to public broadcasting of audio and video.
- Online coursework must be pre-approved. No credit will be transferred retroactively.
- Exeter High School will not grant credit for the online course until an official record of the final grade has been received. The student must request that an official transcript be sent to the EHS Guidance Department.
- Credits and a grade will be earned. The grade earned will be included in the student's Grade Point Average (GPA). The student's official EHS transcript will document that the course was taken online.
- A student must be enrolled in five Exeter High School courses each semester to be considered a fulltime student at Exeter High School.
- Application forms are available in the Blue Commons from Mrs. Freyberger, Curriculum Administrator.
